This time last year I was preparing to be inducted as your parish priest, and we journeyed through Holy Week accompanied by Fr George Guiver from the Community of the Resurrection. This year Holy Week starts in our parishes with the visit of the Bishop of Grimsby who will have been touring the parishes and also joined us for a special service on Palm Sunday. The year in-between has been very busy and for me the year has most certainly flown by. Here are just a few of the activities that have been going on in our churches during the year.

It has been a privilege to baptise children and adults in all five churches and the first Teddy Bear's Picnic held last summer was a great success thanks to all those teddies turning up! FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP OF LINCOLN

I have recently made my maiden speech in the House of Lords. You will find a copy of the speech on the diocesan website, but I began by thanking those who had made me welcome and referring to the beauty that surrounds us in our diocese and also the rugged, independent-mindedness of its people.

During the speech I also referred to my working-class roots and my early life in the former steel town of Consett, in north-west Durham, and the fact that I found faith and a vocation to the priesthood at the age of 13. The call to this vocation was a surprise to me, and a surprise that has not entirely left me; that God was calling someone like me to be a priest.

This vocation has taken me to south London, Hampshire and Portsmouth, and, for the past six years, the Diocese of Lincoln, and my ministry in such settings informed the text for my speech, which was part of a response to the economy in the light of the Chancellor of the Exchequer's Spring Statement.

As I stated, there was much to welcome in what was announced in the Spring Statement. The light at the end of the tunnel, the modest improvement in economic forecasts and the prospect of an increase in spending on and investment in public services will be good news to the people of Lincolnshire, especially if what is devoted to Lincolnshire addresses the challenge we face.

In our local context, we can see the challenges facing areas such as health and education and, as a result of climate change, our environment. We face such challenges while seeking to fulfil our duty to seek to create a fairer and more integrated society, where none feel 'left behind', and where every person is shown love and given the opportunity to flourish and fulfil their calling.

As you read these words, we will have recently celebrated the joy of Easter. Lent, Holy Week and Easter present us with the opportunity to reflect, listen, prepare and resolve to act as we embrace the hope that is to be found in the message of resurrection. At this time of a personal new beginning in the House of Lords, I resolve to offer a further public voice for the people of our diocese, and, with you, to continue to try to transform lives across greater Lincolnshire.

ATTENTION ALL BIRD FEEDERS

I am a keen birdwatcher, especially from my kitchen window. I love to watch them come and go on my feeders, as I am sure many other people in the Owmby group do.

I live in Spridlington and over the last couple of months I have noticed some worrying sights - a great tit with a huge lump on the side of its head (almost as large as its head), a chaffinch which was very wobbly and just kept falling over, a disabled pied wagtail and then today a great spotted woodpecker with a lump above its beak. I cannot be sure about the chaffinch or the pied wagtail but I can tell that the great tit (which I no longer see) and the woodpecker had/have Avian Pox.

Obviously feeding garden birds can be really beneficial, particularly during the harsher winter months, but we should be aware that garden feeding can also promote the transmission of some diseases including Avian Pox and finch trichomonosis. Simple steps to prevent the spread of disease include offering a variety of food, feeding in moderation (so that feeders become emptied every 1-2 days), regularly cleaning bird feeders and rotating feeding sites to avoid accumulation of waste food or bird droppings. Feeders, bird tables, bird baths and hanging feeders should be washed every one to two months (ideally, using a 5% disinfectant solution), and once washed feeders should be moved to a new area to prevent spread of disease.
