FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

My dear friends,

ALL FAITHS AND NONE

I missed the Living Islam Festival on the Lincolnshire Showground at the end of July. I didn't know about it until I was going round the A15/A1500 roundabout to church on the Sunday morning, and by then it was too late.

But I know a man who did make it. A friend from Lincoln, Roman Catholic as it happens, was manning a stall there. And this is some of what he writes...

What I did not expect was the immediate sense of nostalgia!

This was a town fete anyone in the traditional 1950's would have recognised; full of children, mums and dads, aunties and uncles. The people who came to our stall were bubbling with joy, clearly happy to be there and surrounded by - a Muslim culture. A culture that made them feel safe, secure and wanted.

Many Muslim brothers and sisters from the county were there. Many had visited and admired our Cathedral and several commented that it felt familiar because like a mosque, at the moment, it is clear of all chairs. I encountered people from every walk of life, business owners, doctors, manual workers, students, you name it, and they were there.

I suspect that out in the country we don't realise just how many people from many different backgrounds and faiths now live in our county. We don't notice many of them in our villages.

I'm very taken by what my friend had to say about Living Islam. Many of us may look back on imagined "good old days" when life was simpler and more stable. He points us towards a community where such values are still treasured.

Unlike many of our schoolchildren today, I've never visited a mosque. That makes me the loser. But I've certainly visited our cathedral (well, I do work there, sometimes), and to have the two compared together is interesting. I wonder which would come across more powerfully as a house of prayer?

For people of other religions do do by and large what Christians do. They believe in God; they trust in God. They worship and they pray. They try to live God-centred lives. They may come at God from a different angle to us, but that's hardly surprising. There's more to God than any of us can get a full view of.

I do believe that all the major religions have things in common. These we should explore and celebrate. We don't see and perhaps we don't know much about our brothers' and sisters' faiths, but if we get a chance, perhaps we should try to find out. It's always good to have our horizons broadened. If the opportunity arises for you, take a good look at someone else's religion.

I really do hope that next time I'll make it to "Living Islam". I'm sure that knowing more about our friends of other faiths would make me at least a better-informed, if not a better anything else, Christian. That can't be bad.

He would miss the wages, but he needed to retire. They could get by. The contractor was sorry to see his good worker go and asked if he could build just one more house as a personal favour. The carpenter said yes, but in time it was easy to see that his heart was not in his work. He resorted to shoddy workmanship and used inferior materials. It was an unfortunate way to end his career.

When the carpenter finished his work and the builder came to inspect the house, the contractor handed the front-door key to the carpenter. "This is your house," he said, "my gift to you."

What a shock! What a shame! If he had only known he was building his own house, he would have done it all so differently. Now he had to live in the home he had built none too well

THE LAW ON CLEARING SNOW AND ICE FROM PUBLIC SPACES

There is no law stopping you from clearing snow and ice on the pavement outside your property, pathways to your property or public spaces. If an accident did happen, it is highly unlikely that you would be sued as long as you:

- 1. Are careful
- 2. Use common sense to make sure that you do not make the pavement or pathway clearly more dangerous than before

People using areas affected by snow and ice also have responsibility to be careful themselves.

TIPS AND ADVICE ON CLEARING SNOW AND ICE

- Start early- it is much easier to clear fresh, loose snow compared to compacted ice that has been compressed by people walking on it
- Do not use hot water this will melt the snow, but may replace it with black ice, increasing the risk of injury
- Be a good neighbour some people may be unable to clear snow and ice on paths from their property
- If shovelling snow, think where you are going to put it so that so it does not block other people's paths or drainage channels
- Make a pathway down the middle of the area to be cleared first, so you have a clear surface to walk on
- Spreading some salt on the area you have cleared will help stop ice forming table salt or dishwasher salt will work, but avoid spreading on plants or grass as they may be damaged by it
- Pay particular care and attention to steps and steep gradients
- Use the sun to your advantage removing the top layer of snow will allow the sun to melt any ice beneath; however you will need to cover any ice with salt to stop it refreezing overnight
- If there is no salt available, sand or ash are good alternatives.





Whilst burglaries are thankfully uncommon in our villages it's nevertheless a good idea to lock downstairs doors and windows, even when your home is occupied. Please also ensure that you remove valuables from your vehicle when parking it overnight. Now may also be the time to consider installing security lighting if your home does not have any. Additional lighting not only discourages a potential thief but also alerts you to anyone that may be around your property during the hours of darkness.
