September is the ninth month of the year in the Gregorian Calendar and one of four Gregorian months with 30 days, beginning on the 1st of September and ending on the 30th of September.

In Latin, septem means "seven" and septimus means "seventh"; September was in fact the seventh month of the Roman calendar until 153 BC, when the first month changed from Kalendas Martius (1 March) to Kalendas Januarius (1 January). In the Northern hemisphere, the beginning of the meteorological autumn is 1 September.

September marks the beginning of the ecclesiastical year in the Eastern Orthodox Church. September begins on the same day of the week as December every year, because there are 91 days separating September and December, which is a multiple of seven (the number of days in the week).

September's birthstone is the sapphire. The meaning is clear thinking.

The Birth flowers for September are the forget-me-not, morning glory and aster.

## **FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST**

My dear friends,

### **PSALM 151**

One of the responsibilities of the canons of Lincoln Cathedral is that they each recite a set psalm or psalms daily. It must be no fun for a canon who ends up with a psalm they cannot relate to.

The psalms are an extraordinary collection. Some are well known, such as Psalm 23, The Lord is my Shepherd. Others are very difficult to get along with.

Some of the psalms are more like complaints against God than songs of praise. But in this unreliable world, perhaps it's right to complain against God from time to time.

Julia Hepburn, one of our readers, has composed an up-to-date psalm, questioning God about some of the things we find ourselves living with. I'm happy to share it with you this month.

*O God, this world, your wonderful world: the world in which you have placed me*

*Your world is more wonderful than I can ever know: I marvel at its beauty.*

*The sights I see, the sounds I hear, the scents and tastes and textures: these things speak to me of your beauty.*

*Your creatures, all living things, relate to one another in such a delicate way: human knowledge only touches the edge of it.*

*We are made in your image: we are privileged to share in your enjoyment of creation.*

*How then should we respond to those things which seem to mar creation: how can I comprehend such things?*

*Why are people starving in Niger today: why do the people of Pakistan suffer death, homelessness and disease after the floods?*

*What should I do: what should be my response?*

*From my comfortable western home: what would you have me do?*

*Should I try to explain; should I give money to the appeal?*

*Should I write letters: go on marches?*

*What response can I give to those who suffer: to those who question?*

*Your love is so great; all encompassing yet intimate.*

*My love so pale: so fragile.*

*O Lord God, show me what you would have me do.*

I'll bet many of us would sympathise with that. We might even find ourselves wanting to use stronger language towards God than Julia does.

Well, if that's the case, then do so. God doesn't mind strong feelings on our part. God might even agree.

And then, who knows? Something might actually be done about some of the pain and injustice too many people have to live with.

God bless us. All of us.

No one can make you serve customers well... that's because great service is a choice. Hamish Mackay, tells a wonderful story about a cab driver that proved this point.

He was waiting in line for a ride at the airport. When a cab pulled up, the first thing Hamish noticed was that the taxi was polished to a bright shine. Smartly dressed in a white shirt, black tie, and freshly pressed black slacks, the cab driver jumped out and rounded the car to open the back passenger door for Hamish.

He handed my friend a laminated card and said: "I'm Wally, your driver. While I'm loading your bags in the trunk I'd like you to read my mission statement."

Taken aback, Hamish read the card.. It said: "Wally's Mission Statement: To get my customers to their destination in the quickest, safest and cheapest way possible in a friendly environment."

This blew Hamish away. Especially when he noticed that the inside of the cab matched the outside. Spotlessly clean!

As he slid behind the wheel, Wally said, "Would you like a cup of coffee? I have a thermos of regular and one of decaf."

My friend said jokingly, "No, I d prefer a soft drink."

Wally smiled and said, "No problem. I have a cooler up front with regular and Diet Coke, water and orange juice."

Almost stuttering, Hamish said, "I'll take a Diet Coke."

Handing him his drink, Wally said, "If you'd like something to read, I have The Wall Street Journal, Time, Sports Illustrated and USA Today."

As they were pulling away, Wally handed my friend another laminated card, "These are the stations I get and the music they play, if you'd like to listen to the radio."

And as if that weren't enough, Wally told Hamish that he had the air conditioning on and asked if the temperature was comfortable for him. Then he advised Hamish of the best route to his destination for that time of day. He also let him know that he'd be happy to chat and tell him about some of the sights or, if Hamish preferred, to leave him with his own thoughts.

"Tell me, Wally," my amazed friend asked the driver, "have you always served customers like this?"

Wally smiled into the rear view mirror. "No, not always. In fact, it's only been in the last two years. My first five years driving, I spent most of my time complaining like all the rest of the cabbies do. Then I heard the personal growth guru, Wayne Dyer, on the radio one day. He had just written a book called *You'll See It When You Believe It*."

Wally the Cab Driver made a different choice. He decided to stop quacking like ducks and start soaring like eagles.

How about us? Smile, and the whole world smiles with you... The ball is in our hands! A man reaps what he sows. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up... let us do good to all people.

## **BISHOP'S LETTER**

### **Giving for a Change**

Until recently, it had never occurred to me that for some people giving is just another form of purchasing. For example, some people are only persuaded to give to charity because they see long-term benefits for themselves in return. Perhaps this is what lies behind the claim that “Charity begins at home”.

Then there are folk in our congregations for whom giving to the Church is simply a way of purchasing ministry for themselves rather than seeing it as a way of providing ministry where it is needed more, and funding is less easy to find. Sadly, people do sometimes write to tell me that they will stop giving to the Church because they no longer have a full-time Priest in their Parish. Clearly for them giving to God is simply a way of purchasing something for themselves.

But surely giving generously to God is our right and proper response to God’s generosity to us. It is not subject to strict cost-benefit analysis. And the same goes for our giving to good causes. We give because we can – and because we can make a difference.

So I ask you to support as generously as you can my Harvest Appeal this year. Proceeds will go to support our on-going commitment to our friends caring for people affected by leprosy in our Link Diocese of Tirunelveli in South India. We will also channel proceeds through Christian Aid to help some of the poorest people in the world affected by drought in Burkino Faso.

These are practical projects designed to provide long-term solutions and not just short-term relief. Perhaps collections at Harvest Services this year could be channelled into this Appeal – and of course, personal donations will also be very welcome.

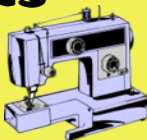

## NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting held on 21st July Cllrs R Bellamy, K Green, A Carter, Mrs A Crowther and J Brindley attended together with PC Oakes, Mr & Mrs Hancock from the Twinning Federation, Mr P Henry and Mrs N Fox (Clerk). Cllr M Crowe had offered his apologies.

Mr Peter Henry was co-opted onto the Council and welcomed as a new Councillor.

Very little crime has been reported but PC Oakes stressed that if anyone sees an unusual face or strange car in this vicinity to please report this to the police. Quite a few tractors have gone missing recently and farmers are being asked not to leave their tractors in fields over night. During the hot spell, a few youngsters have been congregating on the corner of Carters Yard and at the junction of Fen Road and Normanby Road in Owmbly and throwing bowls of water at passing motorists. This could cause a serious accident, especially if the water is aimed at a cyclist who might swerve to avoid the water, but go into the path of another vehicle apart from making motorists wet if windows are open.

Sorry kids - please find a safer way to have fun and please do not leave litter behind.

Mr & Mrs Hancock explained the ins and outs of twinning, it seems quite straight forward once an area abroad has been decided upon but it was agreed to include this in a survey which is the process of being devised to ask residents a few questions to find out the range, ideas and hobbies of the villagers - with the aim to achieve some of the ideas if within the remit of the Parish Council.

The grass verge down Highgate Lane is causing a lot of problems and Highways keep telling your Parish Council that it will be done. The verge on Beck Hill is also on the list for Highways to come out and cut it back.

We are still waiting for WLDC to erect some "no fouling" signs along some grass verges and we are still chasing up the people who repaired the church wall as some of the repaired areas are already crumbling and the topping does not blend in.

It is a shame that some youngsters are causing problems for the club for young people. It has taken a long time to get this club up and running, so please do not spoil it for those who are enjoying it. The school is still not allowing the club to erect a store in which to keep their equipment. The club should really be allowed to keep their equipment in the community hall, but the school are not allowing that either.

Cllr Ken Green is looking into the possibility of having the war memorial lowered to ground (pavement) level and inset, though there are quite a few groups who need consulting to see if this is feasible.

### NOTE OF MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 12TH AUGUST 2010

**Adjournment period for public questions** - Matters raised and discussed were: Two of the vertical concrete slabs holding back a raised section of bank on the west side of Bishop Norton Road are broken and need replacing. The verge edging the field on Washdyke Lane needs strimming. The Environment Agency has agreed to de-weed Seggimoor Beck where it is obstructed. It was agreed that the draft agenda for Council meetings should be published (notice boards and Internet) on the Monday of the week before each meeting and finalised in the light of any comments received one week before the meeting. The meeting was then re-convened and Cllr N Simpson took the chair.

**Co-option of a new councillor** - Councillors agreed unanimously that Mr David Rayner should be co-opted on to the Council, which is now at full strength.

**Highways** - The Lincolnshire Highway Maintenance Team is scheduled to be working in the Parish in the near future. The Clerk will liaise with the Team and pass on details of any minor highway repairs that need to be done.

**Church clock** - The fault in the village clock has been repaired at no cost as the faulty part was under warranty.

**Environment matters** - The Council agreed to pay for a one-off trim of the verges in Back Lane. Councillors discussed the possible need for a "Make Glentham Tidy" campaign and agreed several actions for tidying up parts of the village.

**Village Hall** - Councillors agreed to recommend the Village Hall Committee to accept a request from the Salvation Army to site a textile recycling bin at the back of the Village Hall.

**Playground** - Play Safe, acting for RoSPA (The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents) are due to visit the playground to carry out their annual safety inspection for the Council.

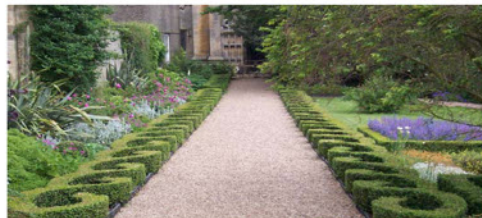

Lincolnshire Police

The Police are often called upon to deal with animal, usually dog, incidents. Here are a few pointers.

### **Can the police do anything about people who let their dogs foul on the pavement?**

It is an offence not to clean up after a dog that has fouled. However, it is not the responsibility of the police but that of the local authority. The maximum fine for this offence is £1000 or alternatively councils can issue a fixed penalty of £50. If you know someone who allows their dog to foul and fails to clean up after the dog, you should make a note of the time and date of the offence and the details of the dog owner and then contact your local authority who will advise you how to proceed.

### **Does my dog have to wear a collar with my name and address on it?**

Yes, the law states that every dog whilst in a highway or public place has to wear a collar with the name of the owner on it. Failure to do so is an offence and could lead to your dog being seized and dealt with as a stray dog. There are exemptions but these apply to working dogs and not for domestic pets. This is not a police matter; it is a matter for the local authority (dog warden) to enforce.



**I have found a dog, what do I do?**

The police no longer have responsibility for stray dogs. You should call should the local dog warden. The local authority dog warden has a responsibility to collect all stray dogs that are found in a public place. The RSPCA will not go out and collect stray dogs.

**My pet has been attacked by a dog can the police do anything?**

It depends on the circumstances but there have been decisions in the past by courts and authorities to suggest that it is the nature of a dog to kill and wound small animals. Therefore, in the event of your pet being wounded or killed by a dog, it is not a certainty that the police would take any action. However, the police will take action if the dog was dangerously out of control in a public place. The only possible recourse is to take civil action against the dog owner but this would depend on the circumstances. However, there are different regulations where the attack involves farm animals. This answer does not take into account deliberate attacks or dogfights, which are offences.

**There is a dog that lives down the street and the owner has let it out without a lead and it has bitten me, what can I do?**

You can report the incident to the local police. There is an offence of having a dog dangerously out of control in a public place. The dog owner (or the person for the time being in charge of the dog) may be prosecuted and could face imprisonment and/or a fine and the courts can make a variety of orders in relation to the dog, which range from muzzling to destruction.

**Change to Neighbourhood Police Area**

From the 9th August 2010 the area covered by the team will be expanded. Currently we cover all villages east of the A15 from Welton, out to Faldingworth and north to Waddingham. From this date we will also be responsible for all villages west of the A15 from Scampton, out to Upton and north to Grayingham. As can be seen from the list of officers below, PCSO Julie McFaul makes a very welcome return to the team. Julie is a highly trained and efficient officer who makes a real difference to the area she polices which is the Scampton to Grayingham beat.

## **WELTON HEALTH CENTRE**

We are pleased to announce that our first GP Registrar, Dr Muhammad Adnan is now in the Practice and will be here until April 2011 and then again after completing a further hospital rotation. Dr Adnan is a fully qualified doctor who is learning the General Practice side of medicine. He will be sitting in on some consultations or seeing individual patients during the next few months under the mentorship of Dr Andrew Barber and Dr Nicola Porter.

The Practice is taking part in a recently piloted scheme to enhance the care of our elderly patients, particularly those over seventy five years of age. This involves evaluating each individual patient and ensuring that appropriate services are offered and available where needed. As part of this project, we are also looking at alternatives to hospital admission in certain circumstances and are working with Lincolnshire PCT and United Lincolnshire Hospitals Trust to this end. Some patients may receive a letter from the Practice to do a self-evaluation and we would greatly appreciate assistance with this.

Could we please remind patients that all telephone calls to and from the surgery are recorded to protect both parties. It is with regret that we find ourselves quite regularly having to listen to recorded calls as a result of staff receiving verbal abuse over the 'phone. Anyone guilty of this may receive a warning letter from the Practice and action will be taken to remove patients from our list if warranted. If there is cause for complaint or dissatisfaction with any aspect of our services we ask patients to speak or write to the manager so that it can be properly investigated, not swear or upset staff who are only carrying out their duties.

In July we noted 61 patients had booked appointments with us which were not kept or advised us cancel. In addition we were notified of 21 non-attendees at hospital appointments.
