BISHOP OF LINCOLN'S LETTER

Dear friends,

At the start of this new month, the long wait for the end of Winter nears its end as the arrival of Spring edges ever closer. And though we know that the warmer weather and all that Spring promises is coming we know, too, that we must wait and be patient for a little longer.

This month we celebrate the feast of Candlemas when we remember Simeon and Anna who waited patiently in the temple to see the Messiah. Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus into the temple as was the custom according to Jewish law and tradition, and Simeon and Anna were at last able to say they had seen for themselves the child who was the light of the world, and the salvation of the world. That was their calling and their task from God.

In a culture and society where so often we are often under pressure to be 'doing', it can be hard to engage in seemingly passive things like watching and waiting, as Simeon and Anna did in the temple.

And yet, their watching and waiting was anything but passive. Simeon and Anna were clear and focused about their call and their task, and in their story there is a lesson for us all.

LOCAL CHARITY QUIZ

Knowledge of trivia was tested this January at the Crown Inn, Glenthams to raise funds for a community defibrillator.

Defibrillators are the only treatment for sudden cardiac arrests, and can increase the chance of survival by up to 85 per cent.

The quiz night marked the launch of a number of quiz nights that will be held throughout the year. Cll Sarah Shaw comments, "the aim is to work together to provide life saving equipment for our rural community. It's great to have the support of local businesses supporting the initiative."

£90 was raised from the quiz and prizes were greatly received from The Crown Inn, Glenthams Village Stores and The Willows. A further £60 was donated from a raffle held in December on the evening by Roy Albett of The Crown Inn in Glenthams, who added, "this initiative will make a difference in the community. I welcome and encourage you all to get together to support this worthy cause and have some fun in doing so."

Help LIVES to save lives

LIVES (Lincolnshire Integrated Voluntary Emergency Service) wants to make sure that any person who becomes acutely unwell or injured in the Spredlington Group area (Glenthams, Normanby, Owmbly, Saxby & Spredlington) will receive rapid emergency care within 6 minutes of dialling 999. LIVES First Responders are specially trained volunteers and are often the first on the scene following a 999 call. They attended over 14,000 999 calls last year, saving almost 250 lives in Lincolnshire. LIVES need First Responder Volunteers to help with their life-saving service in the Spredlington area. Any person over 18, with a car, in good health and living locally can be trained to provide basic life support, relatively simple skills that do save lives. First Responders work in partnership with EMAS (East Midlands Ambulance Service), with two dedicated LIVES desks at ambulance control. When a 999 call comes in, the controller contacts the nearest on-call LIVES Responder, who is usually able to arrive at the scene within five to six minutes of the call. Those first few minutes before or during an emergency such as a stroke or heart attack are critical for someone's recovery or even survival. Could you help this community?

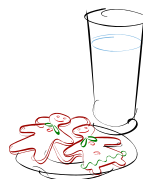


The children from Sunday Special Sunday school in Owmbly would like to invite other children to join them.

The last meeting was held on 2nd December 2013 and all the Councillors attended, including our new co-opted Councillor - Miss Izzy Lane, who was given a warm welcome. District Councillor Jeff Summers and County Councillor Lewis Strange also attended, but there were no members of the public.

The church wall is still unfinished, so we now have to wait until the weather improves, when once again Cllr Roy Bellamy will continue to remind the BTCV.

We are still trying to find someone to repair the War Memorial in time for November 11th.

Highways have, at last, repaired two broken kerb stones outside Rose Cottage and white lines have been reinstated in most areas.

The broken gate post on one of the gates at the entrance of the cemetery is awaiting repair.

Owmby and Normanby Councillors have agreed to continue with the maintenance team who cut the grass and hedges in the cemetery.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on February 5th at 4 Field Lane.

OWMBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Notes of the Council Meeting held in the Parish Church on Tues 13th November 2013

REPORT FROM POLICE, DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

There have been two incidents for the area - a commercial burglary where red diesel had been stolen and one incident relating to lamping.

Cllr Strange reported that the government has asked for a cutback on rates. He reported that 'Energy From Waste' is working well and that it will cut out landfill very quickly. He is still awaiting news following the library consultation.

OUTSTANDING BUSINESS

a) Playing field update - Owmbly Parish Council have had a meeting with Mr. Marshall and the Lincolnshire Land Trust in order to ascertain what he would like to do with the land, number and type of houses he is proposing. Both parties were agreed a maximum build of 4/5 houses plus any affordable ones on the piece of the field that joins / accessed off Fen Road. The field that runs along Normanby Road to be given to the 2 villages as a playing field. Owmbly Parish Council is now trying to arrange a joint meeting with Normanby Parish Council and Community Lincs in order to move the project forward. The next step as advised by the Lincs Land Trust will be a joint housing needs

survey of both villages to see if any affordable houses are required, if the answer is yes then some can be added to the scheme.

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS FOR PAYMENT

Resolved the following to be paid; £130.80 VEOLIA (grass cutting), £82.08 Green Grass Contracting (cemetery maintenance), £25 Owmbly by Spital PCC, £196.99 Clerk's salary and expenses, £40 Normanby by Spital PC (cemetery).

HIGHWAYS MATTERS

The Councillors raised that there are pot holes on the Owmbly Cliff Road. Resolved Cllr Crompton-Howe will provide location reference and photographs for the clerk and Cllr Strange to send to highways. The clerk has reported a broken sign to highways.

REPORT FROM CLLR MELLOR RE HEMSWELL WIND FARM

Cllr Mellor attended the meeting at the Epic Centre. He reported that the wind farm had been unanimously turned down. The applicant may now appeal or apply again with a smaller version. Cllr Mellor will continue to follow this. He also reported that he is involved with the Core Strategy which requires Lincolnshire to generate 60% of its energy through renewables. This would require 6 major wind farms in NK and WL. He has registered Owmbly by Spital's objections regarding this.

NOTES ON COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 2nd JANUARY 2014

The vacancy for a **new Councillor** has been filled. Glentham Parish Council welcomes **Ian Pilcher**, who was elected by co-option. Ian brings extensive administrative experience to the position and his contribution to the Council's working is already becoming evident.

As previously reported, the **Parish Plan** is due for renewal this year, and arrangements are being made to renew it for a further five years. A full involvement by the whole community is sought, since this will help shape the future for everybody. Initially, a representative of Community Lincs has been invited to the Council meeting on 3rd April. This organisation played an important role in the first plan, both practically and financially, and the meeting will be dedicated to its input and to answer questions. The general public are invited to participate or just to come and listen. A committee will be formed to steer the project, and anyone interested in participating can contact any Councillor or the Clerk or indicate their interest on the night.

The preferred location for a new **bus shelter** is

in the car park of the Crown Inn. Several hurdles remain to be overcome, but the Council appreciates the cooperation of the tenants and the owner of the Crown, and hopes that the various permissions and the funding can be gained during 2014.

A budget has been set for the coming financial year, which starts on 1st April. Following from this, the **precept** has also been set, and once again the Council has maintained the same figure as for previous years by drawing upon reserves. The hope is that parishioners will benefit from this stability in costs in a time of ongoing financial pressures on us all.

The Council gratefully accepted applications for the voluntary posts of **Flood Warden** and **Assistant Flood Warden** from Neil Simpson and Mick Brand respectively.

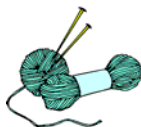

I've always enjoyed sport - ever since I can remember. It was the only thing I was interested in at school - the only thing I used to practise regularly. I became good at it - and the better I became, the more I enjoyed it. So getting fit and healthy was never a problem to me. He looked hard at me and gave me a little smile. "Thankfully, I was saved. My friend saved me from doing the unspeakable."

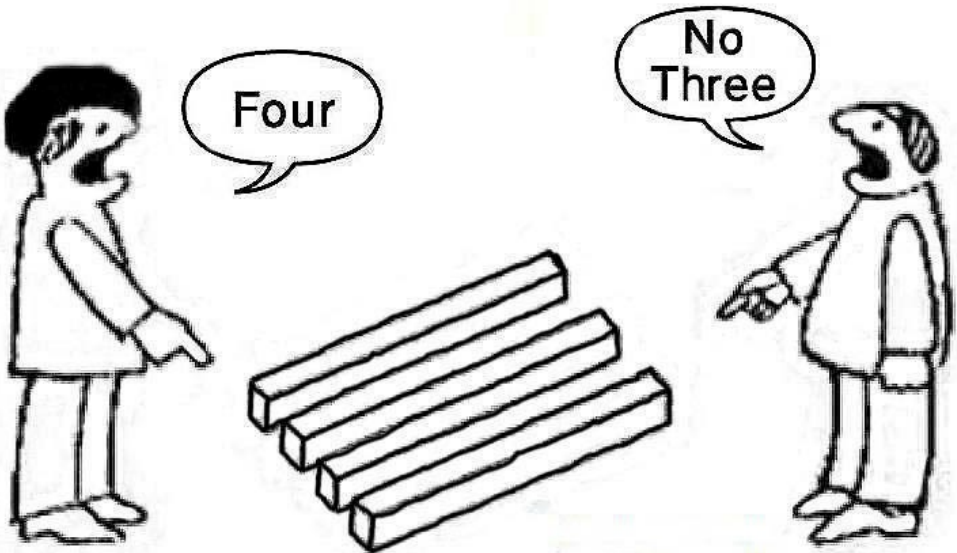
I heard the gasp go through the crowd as this handsome, popular boy told us all about his weakest moment.

WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

Leaflets entitled "Better Information Means Better Care" are currently being sent from NHS England to all patients in our area to advise them of the new Data Sharing opportunities available to all patients. This sharing is designed to help understand the health needs of a population and the quality and care provided to patients as well as guide decisions about how to manage NHS resources so that they can best support treatment and care of all patients. Patients have the opportunity to decline the option to share but need to write to their GP advising them of their specific wishes - otherwise it will be assumed that your data is available to share, as explained in the leaflet, and your GP will not be in a position to prevent this. Unlike other exercises, this means that your data WILL be shared unless you advise us otherwise so it is important to let us know if you do not wish this to happen. Leaflets for patients to complete to deny access will be available at our reception desk and website and a signature for each member of the family will be required to action this opt out.

We are evaluating the changes to our appointment and acute illness clinic as it is now four months since we introduced the changes.

Questionnaires will be issued to patients using the surgery during the next few weeks and responses used to further evaluate our services. As a reminder, our acute clinic runs daily between 8.30 - 9.15am and is for new / acute problems. Appointments are available throughout the day and released up to two weeks ahead. Whilst we have a finite number of available appointments, anyone needing to be seen the day can either attend the acute illness clinic or speak to the doctor on call, who has no pre-booked appointments and can arrange advice over the telephone or a consultation as deemed appropriate. We are pleased to note that our DNA (did not attend) stats have improved considerably since the introduction of this system. As several of our doctors now work part time and also have other commitments within the Practice it is not always possible to see a doctor of choice on each occasion.

Finally, many thanks to everyone for all very generous gifts and cards over the Christmas period and may we wish everyone a very Happy New Year.
