

Notes from the last meeting which was the Annual Parish meeting held on the 21st May 2007.

Present : Cllrs G. D. Crompton-Howe (Chairman); Mrs J.M. Buckley, D.J. Mellor; Mrs D Leah. The Clerk & 6 Members of the Public

Apologies : Cllr l Strange.

The Chairman summarised the work of the Parish Council over the past year which included the memorial restoration and the book "They went to war" as well as various surfacing and drainage works. He thanked Avril Harrison who was standing down again as a Parish Councillor and welcomed Mag's Parry who was picking up the reins from Avril.



PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

1. A complaint was made about the state of the footpath on Fen Road in front of the council houses to Carters Corner.

2. The Black and White finger posts need replacing on Pump Hill.

3. Village name plate still not replaced on Spridlington Road.

(Chairman has already been onto the Highways about the above and is awaiting a site visit)

4. Ivy overhanging the footpath outside the empty rectory, this has now been cleared.

5. Several complaints about dog fouling particularly in Church Lane where owners appear to let their dogs out at night to do what comes natural where ever. Villagers are asked to report any such behaviour, the dog warden has offered to collect any dog found wandering on its own. Dogs should be kept on a lead when outside your property.

6. Also a complaint that many drivers, some of whom were local, were persistently breaking the speed limit through the village.

NB. Road Safety Partnership is going to train a parishioner with a speed gun so numbers of speeding cars can be reported to the police for warnings to be given.

Remember if you see any cars persistently speeding or causing a nuisance use the Police information Box in the post office they are using it and it is working. The same goes for any anti social behaviour the police community support officer is only too pleased to have a word.

Report from Glentham Parish Council

Matters discussed at the Parish Council meeting held on 14th June included: <u>Grasscutting</u> – it was agreed to contact LCC with a view to taking over all village grounds maintenance. Highways are to be asked for a new sign for Little Hill and refurbishment of Bishop Norton Road sign.

<u>A631</u> – Chairman, Cllr G Wiseman and Cllr Mrs D Wiseman are to attend a Road Safety Partnership meeting.

<u>Playground surface</u> – Grants are being sought for resurfacing.

<u>Clocking winding mechanism</u> – Cllr J Summers and Clerk are still seeking funding. It was agreed to write to the PCC asking if they could obtain a grant and offering match funding from the Parish Council.

<u>Lane from Highfield Terrace to A631</u> Concern was raised regarding this area. <u>Steering Group</u> Cllr G Fox thanked all those who had helped with the recent Hog Roast and said that there were numerous activities booked for the summer. <u>Finance</u> – In hand $\pounds14971.31$.

GLENTHAM PARISH PLAN

Thank you to those who turned up to the Hog Roast on 2nd June – the pork (and the crackling) was delicious. Your comments and answers to the questions were very helpful and, in some cases, surprising. This will help the Steering Group put together a more meaningful questionnaire which will be circulated to all households in the autumn. It is a shame that more people did not turn up – we had enough food to feed at least another 50 people.

There seem to be a few misconceptions about the Parish Plan. The Steering Group is an independent body of local volunteers (although it is a requirement that the finances are administered through the Parish Council). The Group's purpose is to seek the views of the people of Glentham about the future of the parish. We are required to try to reach every household in the parish and that is why we are holding free events targetted at different age groups to ensure that everyone can have their say. It is funded by a grant of $\pounds 3,000$ from Community Lincs (formerly the Community Council of Lincolnshire), £250 from Glentham Parish Council and £100 through the Group's own fundraising activities. The grant from Community Lincs came from a pot of money set aside for the purpose of producing Parish Plans. This money could not be used for any other purpose, such as funding for the Village Hall. If Glentham did not have the money for the Parish Plan then it would have been lost to another parish in Lincolnshire. The Steering Group is, however, making every effort to spend the funding locally so that it is ploughed back into the local community – through hiring the Village Hall for events and using local businesses to supply goods and services.

Garden Tip

Keep Clematis Moist

Clematis grow best in moisture retentive soils and if we get another very dry, hot spell like last year plants may suffer. Some clematis have already struggled this spring, probably as a result of last years drought and a wet winter. To help your plants stay healthy and growing through the summer, give them a thorough watering and then mulch with a thick layer of garden compost or well rotted manure. This seals in moisture and creates cooler growing conditions for the roots.



SERVICES TO HELP LOCAL SMOKERS QUIT

We're expecting that lots of local smokers will want to guit when the no smoking law comes into force on 1 July 2007. Therefore, to make sure you know where to get help, Market Rasen Surgery and Boots would like to advise people in the Market Rasen area of the smoking cessation services provided in the town. Smoking cessation support is available at both the surgery and Boots as follows: If you're generally fit and healthy, pop into Boots at any time where you can make a 30 minute appointment with Eileen Fisher. Eileen is available for smoking cessation appointments on Fridays and Saturdays. If you have any health problems, make a 20 minute appointment with practice nurse Sue Morris at Market Rasen Surgery. If your health problems are more complex or serious, Sue or one of the GPs will refer you to Jill Cox, who is the local Phoenix level 3 smoking cessation advisor. Jill holds regular sessions at the surgery. If you're a new or expectant mum (or dad) and would like help in quitting, contact Liz Bunney, the surgery's attached health visitor, or ask your midwife to refer you to Liz. Wherever you seek help, Eileen, Sue, Liz and Jill are all fully trained and will help each person who wants to quit on a one-to-one basis using an individual approach. At the first consultation they will help you start to plan your 'quit' day as planning is the key to successful giving up. The smoking cessation advisors will offer support in the form of encouragement, tips and counselling and will give advice on which nicotine replacement therapies are best for you, or other



methods of stopping smoking. They also have other useful devices such as a machine which shows how much carbon dioxide is in your lungs. A course of six appointments normally runs for 12 weeks. These services are available to all, including children aged 16-18 and all contact with healthcare professionals is confidential. Five important facts about smoking in the UK. More than 80% of smokers start smoking when they're teenagers. About half of all regular cigarette smokers will eventually be killed by their habit. People do give up - 20% of women and 28% of men are ex-smokers. Stopping smoking can make a big difference to your health - it is never too late to stop smoking to greatly benefit your health. For example, if you stop smoking in middle age, before having cancer or some other serious disease, you avoid most of the increased risk of death due to smoking Polls show that people underestimate the health risks of smoking and the effects of passive smoking: breathing second-hand smoke increases the risk of heart disease, lung cancer and other conditions.
