RECTOR'S LETTER

My dear friends,

Organs and organists

Many people will know that playing the organ is one of my hobbies. In fact, at one time it was part of my living. I have a great fondness for the instrument and its music. And recently organs have made the news in two ways.

The first is a story put about by many of the papers that new EU regulations were about to make both the building of new organs and the restoring of old organs illegal, because organ pipes are made partly of lead (and have been for over 1,500 years), and organs are nowadays generally blown by electricity. There is indeed a new EU ruling, but it's been known about for more than a year, and the organ builders have made their objections known. The government has now definitively stated that this rui;ling will not apply to organs. Whew!

The other story is about a church in the South of England which cannot find an organist any more, & so has bough a black box (a "karaoke machine", as the papers put it) to play their hymns for them. Nothing new in this either. I purchased the organ in my garage from a church in Kent nearly 10 years ago so that they could afford to buy such a black box too. They hadn't had an organist of their own for 7 years.

And that concerns me a lot more, for two reasons.

Firstly, organists are rare people. We are very lucky to have at least five regular organists in the Owmby Group of Parishes, including one very talented teenager, our second organ scholar. But it's a pity we haven't more organists. Can you play a keyboard? Did you once have piano lessons? Would you like to have a go at playing the organ, even just for its own sake to start with?

If so, then do please get in touch with me.

The second point, is that to sing along in church to a mechanical black box is being dishonest, & we shouldn't be being dishonest in church. We are real people and we worship a real God, led by a real minister. Why should we introduce something false, something unreal, something "virtual", to use the modern term, into our worship?

If we haven't got an organist, then perhaps we should sing unaccompanied instead. It would be more true, more honest, more natural. We have had voices for longer than there have been organs, & certainly for longer than we've had karaoke machines. Why not just use them.

As a nation we've almost forgotten how to sing, and this is a bad thing. We live in a world where everybody takes pains to get the right sort of exercise, to keep our bodies in the best of health. This needs to include our voices, or we'll forget how to use them. And there is nothing quite as beautiful as the sound of unaccompanied singing.

Actually, organs were originally put into churches to be played when people weren't singing, not when they were. But things have changed, and we have got used to the idea of the organ supporting our voices. Perhaps it's a bit like using the car instead of walking. Once upon a time there were only feet!

By the time you read this issue of Signpost, we hope to have put in a bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund for a grant towards the restoration of the historic organ at Spridlington. Together with its neighbour at Hackthorn, they make quite a pair, two out of the only six listed organs in Lincolnshire.

May they be played, and sung to, for many years to come. All to the glory of God. For there is nothing quite like the sound of a fine pipe organ.

NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Two Council meetings and the Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Annual Parish Council meeting have been held.

It has been agreed to write to the Highways Department to ask for the road sign on the A15 to have "-by-Spital" added. Lewis Strange has said that the zigzag markings in front of the school and a 20mph sign are still in the pipeline. The financial reports had been received and approved – agreed to donate £100 to the Signpost and pay £750 to the Clerk.

Cllr Ken Green is in the process of producing a booklet which will contain useful information for new residents (£25 was paid to him for expenses).

Parking on the pavement by the new houses on Private Lane is causing problems – residents and their visitors are requested not to block the pavement.

The stone wall surrounding the church is due to be repaired and the Main Street road sign will be replaced.

Councillor Jeff Summers gave a resume on what WLDC has achieved this year and what they hope to achieve in the future.

One of our Councillors – Alexis Rago has decided to step down and thanks were recorded for his input during his tenure in office, so at the co-option meeting - Cllr. Adam Carter (due to a clitch) was re-elected into office along with David Kelsey of Sandlewood, Private Lane.

At the Annual Parish Meeting, held on Wednesday 10th May in the School Hall, 6 members of the public attended and all Councillors were present. The chance of finding land for a play area still looks unlikely. The financial report was received by the meeting. Cllr Adele Crowther is going to do a website for Normanby. The Chairman's report was received by the meeting. It was noted that criminal damage has occurred in the school playing field and although the graffiti which appeared around our village and Owmby the other day was cleaned up quickly – the persons responsible have been reported to the Police. It was suggested that these culprits be "named and shamed". Parents, who bring their children to school by car and use the pub car park are turning off Main Street much too quickly and cutting the corner. Children and the elderly are likely to be hit by a car if this practice continues. Parents are asked to take care when turning in. Once again speeding traffic through the village was mentioned, some overgrown hedges and trees are causing a problem for pedestrians (traffic can not see far enough ahead). More dog bins are to be requested and Lewis Strange to be asked to try to get the zigzag lines painted on the road by the school as soon as possible.

The really good news was to hear that $\pounds 3,750$ has been awarded to the Parish Council. This is due to the hard work that Jim Connors has put into obtaining this grant so a he can produce a book, with detailed information about the fallen hero's whose names appear on the War Memorial. All this money will go into producing this book.

At the Annual Parish Council Meeting which followed Cllr. Roy Bellamy was re-elected Chairman for the forthcoming year and Cllr Mrs Adele Crowther was reelected as Vice-Chairman.

PRUNE YOUR SPRING- FLOWERING SHRUBS

With the late spring, many early flowering shrubs have gone on longer than normal, filling the garden with lovely colourful blossom. As their flowers start to fade it's time to decide whether to prune.

If your plants are only a few years old, they probably won't need much pruning apart from trimming back a few branches to maintain a good shape.

Older shrubs will need a little more attention to encourage new growth and keep them a good shape. To do this, remove a few of the oldest branches, cutting them out close to the ground. This encourages new branches to grow and prevents the shrubs from getting too woody at the base. Also, shorten any long branches sticking out of the top of the plant. When you've finished pruning, the plant should look almost the same as before but tidier and not as dense.

Pruning now gives your shrub the full growing season to make new shoots that will carry the flowers next spring.

The World Famous Glentham Duck Races, 2006

Easter Sunday dawned bright and sunny, giving a boost to the Duck Day organizers, already buoyed by the late news the previous day that DEFRA had allowed the go-ahead for the 2006 Glentham Duck Races after all runners were certified free of Bird Flu!

Glentham villagers turned out in style and by the time of the first heat, over 90 ducks had been purchased and were jostling for position on the starting line.

Suddenly the starting bell rang out and the runners were off, accompanied by raucous duck calls from along the Beck. Very quickly, the more nimble ducks headed off into the distance.

However, the "Official Going" was described by the Clerk of the Course as "Shallow", and so it proved to be. Urged on by their respective owners, ducks took what appeared to be an unassailable lead, only to flounder on rocks and weeds buried only just below the surface.

After three incredibly exciting heats, the field was whittled down to just nine super-ducks, including the 2005 winner, Duck 99.

Between the excitement of the racing, refreshments and face-painting in the village3 hall proved extremely popular.

In the grand finale, these nine came under starters orders: the bell rang out and they were off!

In the early stages, all seemed lost for 99 as he swiftly fell behind the field. However, by the middle of the course the runners had bunched together, setting up the prospect for a thrilling end to the race. And so it proved to be. All nine finalists ran neck & neck into the final third of the race. The 2006 Duck-Day title was up for grabs until the runners swam into the shallow rapids below the footbridge. Here, duck after duck ran foul of the treacherous underwater hazards, when Duck 99, this year trained and owned by the Randall family, skilfully negotiated the rocks and weeds to romp home by a clear 5 lengths.

Congratulations to the Randalls. Duck 99 is clearly a bird built for speed, the Red Rum of the avian world. Your many hours of secret duck training on Seggimoor Beck so clearly paid dividends!

Aspecial mention also to Steve Batey and Diane O'hare for second and third places.

As always, a big round of thanks to the Village Hall Committee for organizing yet another successful Duck Day, which this year raised over £250 for village hall funds. But even greater thanks to the generous people of Glentham for your continuing support.

<u>Police National Legal Database -</u> Every week the Police receive thousands of non-emergency calls from members of the public. Important as they are, these calls are time consuming and many of them will be questions about routine aspects of the criminal law and Police procedures. Many of these questions will be



repeated hundreds of times over – simply because members of the public have no other way of finding the relevant information – until now. The P.N.L.D has compiled a database of more than 500 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs), which is available to the public via the Internet. The address is <u>www.askthe.police.uk</u> As well as a wide selection of nationally asked questions, local Police Forces can provide their own information and FAQs to provide a local service to local people. Information will be updated as soon as there are changes; there is also the opportunity to suggest your own question if the one you require is not there.

<u>Normanby</u> – Last month I reported that a suggestion box had been placed in the Normanby Post Office. Since then I have received criticism of the box from a local representative on behalf of a number of members of the public and shopkeepers. As a result I have decided to remove the box. We have an identical one in Waddingham, which has been a success. I'm sorry to have to have to report this.

<u>Crime in your area</u> – Normanby – On or around the 29th April a number of cars and property were sprayed with white paint. The offenders were traced and have been dealt with.

WELTON FAMILY HEALTH CENTRE NEWSLETTER

Thank you again for feedback relating to our telephone system changes. Some people are obviously pleased by the fact that there is no longer the continuous engaged tone which previously caused frustrations and complaints - others obviously do not like waiting in a queue. We are sorry that we cannot please everyone but we are trying to modify where possible to accommodate all the suggestions we receive. Please note there is an option to cancel appointments when the surgery is closed which may be convenient to some patients and please also note all calls are recorded.

We are able to look closely at the telephone statistics and during the week after Bank Holiday recently (ie four working days) we received 2506 incoming calls, our average response time was 5 seconds, average length of call 45 seconds and a total of 25 people hung up (less than 1%) before they were dealt with. This gives some indication of the volume of calls we experience during a working week and can explain why sometimes there is a need to queue. We have increased our pre-

bookable appointment slots and are now offering an open access surgery every day – Monday to Friday from 11.00am to 12.00pm, which we hope will also reduce the need to ring in each time to book an appointment slot.

Dispensary have again asked if patients using the repeat medication ordering service could ensure that they tell us each time where they wish their medication to go to – and whether or not they wish the chemist to deliver it or whether it will be collected. We do not operate a system whereby we automatically send prescriptions to a certain chemist as this could be seen as the practice directing patients – we need separate instructions each time a request is made. The forms which patients have been asked to sign in the past have been for the respective chemists information – not for surgery use.

Many patients will know our District Nurse, Heather Whitwell, who has worked in the practice as part of the team for many years. Heather has not enjoyed the best of health in recent months, although thankfully is now " on the mend " and has decided to take early retirement.
