### PRAYER FOCUS FOR JUNE

**Our Father Who Art in Heaven...** So begins the prayer that over 2000 years ago Jesus taught to His disciples. It remains the prayer that over 2 billion Christians say on a daily basis. It is also the only prayer that many non-Christians know and is often used by them at times of need in their lives. The good thing about praying is that it can be done wherever we may be; at home, at work or relaxing. Praying can be done when we are alone, in private or when we are with others.

Sometimes it is not possible for us, in these parishes, to come together in prayer but it may be possible for us to pause for a minute or so (wherever we are) to say The Lord's Prayer. This is what The Ministry Team is doing. So, can we encourage you to join in with this short, simple prayer at 12 noon each day? (The Lord's Prayer takes about 40 seconds to say.)

By setting aside this time you will know that you are part of a church in prayer. If you find that sometimes you are not able to join in at 12 noon every day (and it will happen) another time will be fine, knowing that even at 6.00pm for someone, somewhere in the word it will be 12 noon.

So, do you have 40 seconds at 12 noon each day to join us in the prayer Jesus taught us? "Our Father Who Art in Heaven...".

### **BISHOP OF GRANTHAM'S LETTER**

Dear Friends,

I think of myself as having been an argumentative teenager. My parents say I wasn't, but I can remember the discussions that we had to this day...

Later life has softened me, I think, but I still enjoy a good conversation, and the excitement of meeting someone with very different views from my own.

How do we develop as human beings unless we are in contact with those who are unlike us in some ways, while being very like us in others? All human beings, all created by God, all with value and purpose and dignity.

One of the great joys of the Church is that it is a body that is in essence inclusive and outward-facing. The gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost is to reveal the possibility of unity in Christ and to give that unity purpose and confidence.

At the first Pentecost, people from all over the known world were able to recognize what they shared, a recognition that was symbolized by the way in which the Holy Spirit enabled them all to understand the message of 'God's deeds of power' as spoken by the Galilean disciples yet heard in their own language of origin.

A shared identity in Christ overcame the negative effects of difference of language, culture and nationality. It also meant that in a time of considerable political upheaval, the Church was able to provide hope because it placed a priority on works of justice and boldly challenged a tendency to self-centredness and fatalism.

United in the power of the Spirit, people looked out, worked together, and were given a new, concrete, objective identity in Christ. Just read the Acts of the Apostles to see this happening.

And the Church of today shares that same identity! We remain a Pentecostal people, empowered and unified by the Holy Spirit.

This Pentecost, as we prepare to vote in a General Election, may we remember our shared identity in Christ, with all that this means for the way in which we should treat each other and contribute to the life of the world. And let us be confident, therefore, in our faith and in our Church. God bless you.

There really is no getting away from the fact that education is about children. Seems obvious when you think about it, but sometimes it needs pointing out, because so much emphasis is placed on 'targets' and 'tables' that it can cause a bit of a fog to form, which can obscure the message from time to time, if we are not very careful.

Of course, we need to be able to keep tabs on how well everyone is doing, so that everyone gets the maximum benefit from their education. One of the ways we do that is by having regular 'peer-reviews', where head teachers from other schools in our Centurion Partnership come and spend time having a really good look at how the school is running and producing a report highlighting their thoughts on how we're doing.

We were extremely proud of our report this year because it told us that one of the major highlights of our school is the children - their behaviour, their attitude to learning and their pride in the school shone through all aspects of the review.

We had another top-notch demonstration of that, when our Key Stage 1 children went off to the Lincolnshire Life Museum. As with a lot of these old buildings, there are lots of special safety instructions which have to be given out and the museum staff were seriously impressed at how well our children listened to and observed the rules during their visit. They also find, as a result, that if you play by the rules, you get to have more fun, like the part where they thought that the large porcelain receptacle might be a giant tea cup! Great hilarity when they learned of its night-time duties in days gone by!

One of the reasons Key Stage 1 had gone our for the morning, was to allow a bit of peace for the Year 6 pupils who were using part of their classroom for 'Toast Week', one of the great traditions of our school which means that the majority of pupils look forward to the time when their progress is measured over the course of a few mornings in early May. We have some pictures on our website which provide a contrast to the media hype about pupil stress at this time. Everyone tries their best, and we are proud of them for that and the way they all support each other in the cleaning up after the pre test toast.

### NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Annual Parish and Annual Parish Council meetings took place in the school hall on 10th May, starting at 7.30pm. All Councillors attended and there were 8 members of the public. Recently re-elected County Councillor Lewis Strange arrived, unfortunately just as the meeting finished - at 8pm.

Cllr R Bellamy read out a very comprehensive report of the highs and lows of what the Parish Council had achieved or not, during the year.

The financial statement was available for everyone to see and the audit form was approved and signed.

Councillor Roy Bellamy was re-elected as Chair and Cllr Mrs Barbara Moulson we re-elected as Vice-Chair.

The defibrillator training session was a success, so much so that another training session will be arranged for anyone who wishes to attend. See a separate notice of who to contact if you want to join in.

There was a discussion regarding the Community Park and three members of the public present signed up as a volunteer to be on the soon to be formed committee. A risk assessment must be completed and a notice should be put up near the entrance of the field, advising the public not to enter. An approximate quote of over £10,000 has been received by the Clerk to Owmby to have the overhead electricity cables put underground, but Cllr R Bellamy said he had spoken to someone who works for the electricity board and it seems it is possible to have the price considerably reduced. Further research will be done. Highways have still not approved dropping the kerb to form an entrance to the field.

The next Parish Council meeting has been arranged for Thursday 13th July.

### WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

**DISPENSARY** - Just a reminder that the Dispensary staff need two working days to process a request for repeat prescriptions please. Therefore, if a request is left on the answerphone or email on a Friday evening, these will be available on Tuesday evening.

If there is an item that you do not usually have on repeat, the staff may need to ask the GP's permission to add this to your records and if the GP says you need to book an appointment then the Dispensary staff must adhere to this. Please do not ask them to overrule the GP's decision.

**DNA's** - In March, patients did not attend for 34 appointments with the doctors and 67 appointments with the nurses, almost 17 hours of clinical time was lost due to patients not attending for their appointments. Please try to remember appointments or cancel with us if they are no longer required.

If you would like to be able to receive booking confirmations and text message reminders for appointments, please see Reception to sign up for this.

**SAMPLES** - Whenever possible, please could we request that patients telephone the surgery between 2pm and 4pm for test results.

**EAR SYRINGING** - In April, a decision was taken to halt the ear syringing service at Welton Family Health Centre. This decision was not taken lightly. Ear syringing is part of a range of unfunded services which some general practitioners have chosen to offer to patients over the years in addition to their core medical services. Due to the severe pressure currently on general practices, many have been forced to review what services they offer in the interest of safety, and as a result the decision was taken locally to withdraw this service.

Having received several complaints, which we completely appreciate and understand, we re-discussed the issue. As a result we have decided to continue with the ear syringing service but on a limited basis. We will allocate a finite number of appointments each week with the Healthcare Assistant and once these have been filled we will operate a waiting list system. We do, however, anticipate this will still provide a much quicker service to patients overall.

We appreciate all patient feedback on this topic and feel happy that we are able to listen to the relevant concerns and respond accordingly.

STAFF TRAINING - The surgery will be closed from 1pm on Tuesday 20th June until 8am on Wednesday 21st June for staff training.

### Do you have 3-4 hours a month to help local baby bereavement Group?

"I found out that I had lost my baby just before Christmas. There are no words to describe the utter despair I felt."

Losing your much longed for baby late in pregnancy or soon after birth is the most awful trauma any parent can experience. A whole future is taken away from that family. Sadly this happens only too



often. Currently 15 babies a day die in the weeks before or just after birth. Sands aims to care for those families with practical and emotional support for as long as they need it.

Members of Lincoln Sands (Stillbirth and neonatal death charity) support group are appealing to the local community to help them recruit new Committee members.

They need a new Chair, Treasurer and Befrienders.

The Chair is responsible to help the committee work together as a team, following the aims of Sands, arrange quarterly committee meetings and an AGM (Annual General Meeting), hold a casting vote, write letters on Group's behalf, liaising with their Network Coordinator and being a point of contact for the Group and being a representative for the Group.

The Treasurer keeps a record of the financial matters for the Group, and ensures all spending has receipts or invoices and are in accordance with the Sands' aims and guidelines.

Befrienders are also needed to provide support to anyone affected by the death of a baby over the phone and in person at group meetings. The new befrienders must successfully complete Sands' befriender training, and a minimum of a year must have passed since their baby died. Sands support groups are run on a voluntary basis by people many of whom have themselves experienced the death of a baby. However not all Committee members have to be bereaved parents. As long as you have an empathy and interest in our work we would urge you to get involved.

Dr Clea Harmer, Chief Executive of Sands, said, "I hope that the Lincoln group will find additional help as soon as possible, so the group can continue to provide support to bereaved parents and their families at a devastating time for them. I would urge anyone in the local area who could help to get in touch."
