FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

My dear friends,

LIFE AFTER PETER ii

Legal stuff. Sorry.

Many years ago I used sometimes to punt on the river in a certain university city. To my own great surprise, I wasn't all that bad at it.

Until one evening, when it got dark and was time to tie up. I had one foot in each of two punts. They were tied together at one end, but not at the other, where I happened to be. You may guess what happened. You are right!

Being parish priest of two very different groupings of parishes can be rather like that. "Very different?" you may remark. "Why? They are both collections of several small village churches." They are, but each has its own very different history. People in one grouping possibly don't know a lot about the history of the churches the other side of the A15.

This is where it gets complicated.

The consequence is that on the one hand legally and technically I am the Rector of the Owmby Group of Parishes, 5 parishes with 5 churches. On the other hand I am Priest-in-charge of the Springline Parish¹, one single parish but with 8 churches. My legal rights and responsibilities as a Rector are different from my legal rights and responsibilities as a Priest-in-Charge. And the way a Group of parishes is administered and governed is different from the way a single parish with several churches is administered and governed. The Owmby Group has 5 Parochial Church Councils. Springline has 1, but also 8 Village Church Committees, each with different duties, rights and responsibilities.

So a legality, which must be attended to but will have little impact on the day-to-day life of the church in our villages, is that the Owmby Group of Parishes and the Springline Parish will after my departure be linked together in what is known as a Plurality. This means that the two benefices² will remain on the one side of the A15 the Owmby Group of Parishes and on the other the Springline Parish, but my successor will, unlike me, have exactly the same legal relationship with and responsibility for both benefices.

All sorts of consequences follow, such as the fact that my successor cannot resign from one without resigning from the other. I could, not that I shall.

All of this is very complicated legal stuff.

The next parish priest of the Owmby Group and of Springline will be the parish priest of a PLURALITY. Make sure that they keep their feet somewhere firm!

Post Box - The Parish Council were made aware of concerns from Parishioners about the closure of the postbox. The closure of the box is a temporary measure and will be relocated.

Noticeboard - It was thought that with the removal of the board from the Post Office porch, a joint noticeboard could be used for Parishioners and the Parish Council. NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Watson - the Chair of Governors to Normanby purchase of the old doctor's surgery in Owmby Governors attended our meeting. Sam agreed to tell the Headmistress some of the plans for the Diamond Jubilee and try to get the children involved, and to see if the hall and maybe the playing field could be used for the day. Sam did not have answers to all the questions put to her, but she agreed to try to find the answers and get back to the Clerk. Sam and Mags were thanked very much for attending the meeting.

PCSO attended the meeting and reported damage to a parked car on Front Street, which was caused by a hit and run driver.

County Councillor Lewis Strange and District Councillor Jeff Summers also attended and explained their Councils are still being squeezed in every sector. Cutbacks are still needed but school finances have been ring fenced. Between £37,500 and £55,000 is being made available to introduce faster broadband to the whole of WLDC area. Council tax is set to rise by 0.57%

It was mentioned in the Signpost - and it does help if people read it.

Three Parish Councillors could not attend this meeting for various reasons but a lot of business was conducted. Nothing has been heard officially about the plans to completely resurface Private Lane and dangerous potholes keep appearing. Highgate Lane is dipping in areas and it was agreed the Clerk ring Highways to report these problems. Two or three quotes are to be obtained regarding the repairs to the War Memorial. Apparently your Parish Council is on Facebook, the church wall should be repaired (again) when the weather improves and the Clerk is still working on the "Emergency Plan".

At the meeting held on 18th January, Sam No progress has been made into the possible School and Mags Perry, the Vice-Chair of and it was agreed that if the renumbering of Main Street goes ahead, to purchase new numbers for any of the residents if they so wish. Now, talking of renumbering Main Street, this has apparently caused a lot of anxiety to some of the residents. Gossip can be such a dangerous thing and while it has to be said that WLDC did not help the matter at all - the overall cost to most of the residents would have been a few stamps and or phone calls. We do not know at this time if the scheme will go ahead. If it does not, this will be a shame for those who wanted their properties numbered logically and if it does go ahead, your Council will try to make this an easy process and give help and advice to anyone who needs it. The Clerk did hear back that not many residents had been informed of this possible change. It was mentioned in the Signpost - and it does help if people read it. Notice of Parish Council meetings are put up on both notice boards and this scheme has been on the agenda since October last year. Certain properties had received letters from the Parish Council. If there is anything you would like to see done or find out what is happened in your village, please let any of the Councillors or the Clerk know - names, addresses and phone numbers on both notice boards - come to meetings, attend the AGM which is being held on Wednesday May 23rd 2012, and read the Signpost.

> Since this meeting a proper committee has been formed to organise the Jubilee Celebrations and the date has been changed to Monday 4th June. Hope to see a lot of you there.

> Also, two volunteers have already come forward to do anything they can for the recreation ground. Thank you for this. Your names have been noted and we will keep you informed of any developments, but it has gone a bit quiet at the moment.

Myself and PCSO Grewal have had a few calls from residents about phone/email scams. Of course we encourage users to delete and not to open or reply to emails! Some useful advice to follow....

Most Internet users are aware of bogus emails. These are requests to supply security information and attempt to get bank and other personal data.

- Never open or reply to an email that may be bogus.
- Use options to block 'spam' emails attachments and pictures.

Links in emails often take the user to a bogus web site. The user may then be passed to a genuine site having entered their personal information on the bogus site.

- Always check the web address and don't rely on links within emails.
- If you suspect that an email is bogus, never open a link within it as this may download a virus.

Targeted attacks are made against individual personal computers. There are many things that can be done to protect the computer.

- Use a full security program suite, firewall, anti-virus, anti-spyware, etc.
- Keep your software up to date using automatic updates.
- Use a housekeeping suite to clean your system.
- Backup your systems regularly, consider using an on-line instant backup facility.
- Secure your Wireless network from unwanted users.
