FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

This month our thoughts are drawn inevitably to all that is recalled and symbolized by the Cenotaph in Whitehall and at Remembrance Day services in towns and villages throughout the land.

During this past year many of us visited Lincoln Castle to view the beautiful display of poppies which, as always, serve to remind us of the dreadful loss of life and the suffering that war brings with it.

Then, again at the Castle, hundreds of us gathered one evening in July to see a re-enactment in drama form of things that were happening in Lincoln in 1916. I refer of course to the Lincoln men and women who, under the direction of Sir William Tritton, created the world's first battle tank. Next time you ride or walk down Tritton Road, spare a thought for all those men and women who worked so hard and put in untold long hours at the Wellington Works of William Foster and Co. in Firth Road, to ensure that the brilliant idea of Tritton and his colleagues could see the light of day and make such a great contribution to the British war effort.

We shall also be remembering in our thoughts and prayers the colossal number of men and women who have died or suffered in the two terrible wars of the last century and in many other conflicts since. I shall myself be thinking of my father who served with the Royal Artillery in France during the first World War (he died when I was ten), and of my dear stepfather who was with the Norfolk Regiment during the second World War and spent four terrible years as a POW in the Far East.

I feel sure that many of you who may read this letter will be remembering with affection their own relatives and friends who have suffered so much because of of the terrible consequences of war.

May the God of peace lead the nations away from war and draw us along the paths of love and peace.

May God bless you and all whom you love.

BISHOP OF GRANTHAM'S LETTER

Dear Friends

On the 8th of this month, the people of the United States of America will go to the polls to elect their President. The campaign thus far seems to have been hard fought. The commentary that I have read suggests that both main party candidates stir strong emotions and opinions. I am not going to venture to predict the outcome, nor to share my own thoughts about which candidate I would be more likely to back, were I eligible to vote.

I am, however, going to invite the people of greater Lincolnshire to pray for the people of the United States: for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in the decisions that they have to take and for the wisdom of the Holy Spirit for whoever may be elected at the end of the campaign.

As I am growing to know and to love the communities of the Diocese of Lincoln through my privileged role as Bishop of Grantham, I think I am recognizing a pretty widespread pride in local identity. I have talked to many people who have lived all their lives on one street in one village, and who are delighted to have done so. Local matters in Lincolnshire.

But local doesn't mean 'parochial', I don't think, and I have had many conversations with people who balance being fiercely proud of their own community with a genuine interest in the affairs of the wider world: compassion for the Syrian people, for instance, or clear views about the international economics of farming, fishing or manufacturing.

It is quite possible to learn from each other, to grow to value each other more deeply, and to be concerned for each other, without necessarily ever wishing to travel too far from one's home or place of birth.

There are many examples in Jesus' teaching and ministry of the ways in which he sought to help people to grow in love and to recognize the things that they share with each other. Many of the challenges that he issues invite self-reflection and repentance - key stepping stones on the road of love. And in St John's Gospel, Jesus describes himself as a vine with many branches, with the Father as the gardener.

The vine of God extends across time and across place, drawing us into relationship with our Creator and our Saviour, and with each other. As members of the vine we can be pruned and we have the capacity to bear fruit.

This month, whatever our personal circumstances, whether we have always lived in one place or have travelled widely, may we try to find time to reflect on the fact that through faith all can be members of the vine of God, and can be both sustained by our membership, and changed by it. Moreover, may we be generous in our praying, for surely someone will be generous in their praying for us, someone whom they have never knowingly met, but whom they know to be part of the Lord's vine.

NORMANBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

1 member of the public turned up to our meeting on Thursday 13th October, a full complement of Councillors but no Police - who now say they will not be sending in regular reports - and neither DC Jeff Summers or CC Lewis Strange could make the meeting.

The school are allowing certain groups to use the hall in the evenings, even during school holidays, which is very pleasing.

We are concerned that **some A&E departments are closing in the evenings**, as the knock on effect for Lincoln County and Boston hospitals could be even longer delays for local people. Agreed to express concerns to Sir Edward Leigh our local MP.

A new Community Defibrillator Scheme has been set up by West Lindsey District Council. Agreed to get more information regarding this scheme.

As no one has expressed concern about the telephone box closure, it looks as though it will close.

Regarding the **turning off of street lights from midnight to 6am**, concerns were raised about safety for people who have to get up early in the mornings to walk their dogs before going to work. Agreed to contact Highways Street Lighting to ask if everywhere within LCC area have their lights turned off.

Cars parking on pavements, on a bend in the road and on the yellow zig-zag lines - would all motorist not only consider other people who may have walking aids or pushchairs but the law. Parking within 10mtrs/32 feet of a bend is illegal (for a good reason as you are causing an obstruction) - no matter for how short a time and the zig-zag lines are also there for a reason, mainly to protect children getting to school, yet at school start and finish time, there are cars parked dangerously. Please also be aware that people have to be able to get in and out of their own entrances. If you are short of time when dropping your child off, try to leave home a bit earlier - easier said than done I know - but please do not be the one who causes a serious accident.

OWMBY BY SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Notes of the Council Meeting held in the Parish Church on 20th September 2016

REPORT FROM DISTRICT COUNCILLOR - Cllr Summers reported that WLDC are very busy producing the Local Plan and continuing with the process of devolution. The 10 councils in Lincolnshire have joined forces as part of the devolution process and as a starting point £15m per year for the next 15 years will be allocated. He reported that devolution will mean greater local control for education, schools and health. The council are trying to ensure that the education system fits our area better and provides young people with the qualifications they need in order to stay in the area. During the consultation process, local people have been very positive about the devolution process. However, very few people actually bothered to take part in the consultation. WLDC are currently purchasing 30 defibrillators to distribute across the area at a discounted rate. WLDC will pay 20% of the cost. Cllr Summers also reported that there is a new development levy on new houses being built to support the growth of schools, health and infrastructure. The Local Plan is proceeding well and the inspection will take pace in November. Cllr Summers recommended that Owmby do carry out a Neighbourhood Plan to ensure future development in the area takes place where local people would like it to take place. He strongly recommended that Owmby and Normanby residents should consider developing a plan together. High quality CCTV has been installed in Market Rasen and Gainsborough.

The Clerk from Normanby, Cllr Mellor and Cllr Bird from Normanby have undertaken an inspection and topple test of the memorials. Cllr Bird has produced a risk assessment, inspection sheet and headstone policy following the inspection. It was resolved that Owmby PC are happy to adopt these. Thanks were offered to Cllr Bird.



Don't be put off by the queue! - we have a team working and patients are seen very quickly. We are also offering booked appointment slots on the same day for children in the "at risk" category or under four years old. The vaccine is given as a nasal spray, no needles involved, and we would encourage all parents to protect their children (and others) by having this.

We have been made aware of an unknown pharmacy company contacting patients trying to sell medication for their condition. They appear to have details of what ailments the patient has and we would like to reassure patients that this information has not come from the practice and we have no knowledge of this company and advise patients to contact the police if they receive any such suspicious calls and do not be persuaded to part with any financial details over the 'phone.
