LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

THE BEATLES FOUR SONGS

I've been 17½ for 52½ years and have only just become 18! Most people like me live in their past and The Beatles are very much a part of that. Somebody once told me that The Beatles only had four songs. John Lennon had a fast song and a slow song and Paul McCartney had a melodic song and a raucous song. Everything they did was a variation of those four.

I'm a preacher. I'm far less talented than John and Paul were and I only have one sermon. Every time I preach I seem to do a variation of that sermon. Just so that you don't have to come to church to hear my sermon, here it is:

"If you want God to do stuff in your life you have to spend time in his presence."

So, personally I spend time every morning with God. It took me a long time to realise I needed to do that - I'd been 17½ for 29 years before I started that discipline.

But one of the best things I do to spend time in the presence of God is the Bible Study Group. We call ourselves a Bible study group but really we'd be better calling ourselves "Let's Talk About It"! Between 2 pm and 4 pm on a Wednesday we chat over our Christian faith issues and once we get started we seem to range over the meaning of life, the world and everything from love to Donald Trump.

At present we're going through a book titled "How To Explain Your Faith" and will be looking at issues including the failures of Christianity, why Jesus and not Buddha; science and faith, why is church so naff, and the big one - suffering.

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP OF LINCOLN

It has been a great encouragement to hear that a large number of people attended the recent launch of the pilot stage of the Community of St Hugh. The launch event, which took place in the magnificent setting of Stow Minster, offered people an opportunity to hear more about this new community, to share in worship together, and pledge to take part in this pilot phase and ongoing shared discussion, prayer and discernment.

The Community of St Hugh is a community called to pray in, with and for the Diocese of Lincoln. It is a community of prayer called into being by God and is open to anyone, regardless of their age or experience. It invites people to deepen their sense of discipleship, their life of prayer and their experience of their faith. As we know, prayer is at the heart of our being as Christians; it should undergird our whole lives and see us set time aside to worship God and also find time to be with God and to listen for his voice in the scriptures and in the needs of others and the world we live in.

In speaking about prayer, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, has said: 'If we want to see things changed, it starts with prayer. It starts with a new spirit of prayer, using all the traditions, ancient and modern. When it comes, it will be linked to what has gone before, but it will look different - because it is a new renewal for new times. God's created community is perfectly designed for its time and place. It almost always comes from below. It comes from Christians seeking Christ.'

Here in the Diocese of Lincoln we have an opportunity and a responsibility to play our part in seeking to renew the whole community of greater Lincolnshire, transforming the lives of all the people God has given us to love and care for. This hope and endeavour will form an important part of our prayers as the pilot stage progresses, ahead of the planned full launch of the community at Pentecost next year (20th May 2018).

Jacobs' Quilts of Many Colours

Many of you will know that our brave and wonderful grandson Jacob, was diagnosed with a massive cancerous brain tumour when he was two years old. He has undergone many long brain operations and sixteen months of chemotherapy - some very aggressive. The Glasgow Children's Hospital, where he is being treated, have amazing brain surgeons, oncologists, neurologists and nursing staff who have all contributed to Jacob's care. Now four years old, he has finished his chemotherapy but will need monitoring for the rest of his life.

As a tribute to the staff and a need to contribute to the research done at the hospital, the family and friends have embarked on different fund raising activities including marathons, mountain climbing, river and loch swimming, a triathlon and musical gigs.

I cannot contribute physically to raise money for the much needed research into children's brain cancer and state of the art medical equipment, but I can sew! I am aiming to make children's multi coloured patchwork quilts which can be used on beds, cots, as picnic quilts or a snuggle for the elderly, a child or pet!

If you can sew, will you please help me to make these quilts by sewing one coloured block?

For those of you who have supported us with your prayers and encouragement we thank you enormously. For those who will be making part of the quilts, a big **Thank You from Jacob.**

- 1. Choose a colour for your block and make up nine squares in any patterned material in that colour ie, dots, stripes, flowers, gingham for each square.*
- 2. Squares should be cut four and a half inches*
- 3. Squares should be sewn together using a quarter inch seam allowance*
- 4. Block should be three squares by three squares*
- 5. Cotton fabric only*
- 6. Any queries, give me a call*
- 7. Bespoke quilts to order. Please get in touch*

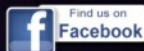

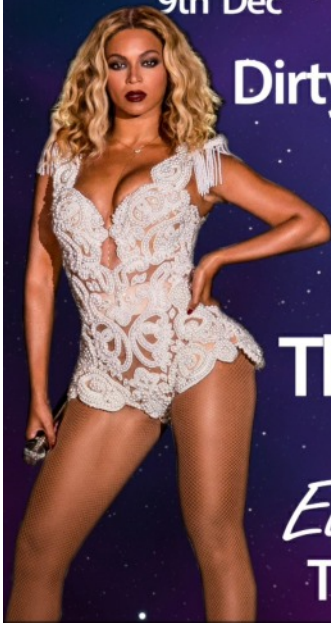

Please note that all students over the age of 16 must make the written application themselves giving their date of birth and brief details of where they are studying, the year they are in and the subjects being taken.

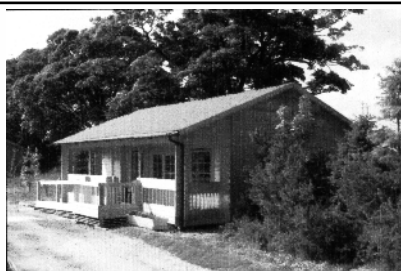



WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

'FLU CLINICS - Thank you to patients that have attended our Saturday 'flu clinics. For those patients that are eligible for a 'flu vaccine but haven't yet attended the surgery, please contact Reception for details of future clinics or to book an appointment.

NURSE PRACTITIONERS / HOME VISITS - We are very lucky to have Mrs Kerry Belshaw, our advanced Nurse Practitioner, working in the Practice.

Over the past few years, the role of the GP has expanded, with increasing demand for managing patients with one or more long-term conditions. In addition to this there has been a national shortage of GP's and developing and employing Nurse Practitioners is one way of addressing this. Nurse Practitioners are educated to undertake all the areas specified in physician associate training, such as taking medical histories; performing examinations; diagnosing illnesses; analysing test results; developing management plans. They are able to prescribe and are registered practitioners.

In addition to her roles within the Practice, and due to the growing pressure and increased demand for visits, Kerry Belshaw may be asked provide home visits for those patients that are unable to attend the surgery.

DNA's - In September, 32 patients did not attend for their appointments with the doctors and 91 appointments with the nurses. Over 20 hours of clinical time was lost due to patients not attending for their appointments. Please try to remember appointments or cancel with us if they are no longer required.

Please let us know if you are unable to make your appointment.

STAFF TRAINING - The surgery will be closed for staff training from 1pm on Tuesday 21st November 2017 until 8am on Wednesday 22nd November 2017. When considering the staff training afternoon, please could we ask that you order any medication with as much notice as possible to enable us to meet the tight deadlines that we face.
