LETTER FROM THE MINISTRY TEAM

Dear Friends,

Just recently I spent a day away on a 'Creative Space' event, making from raw materials a piece of felt. Laying down the soft merino tops in sequence and building up layers incorporating different colours and different fibres, then getting everything very wet and soapy and manipulating the fibres so that they 'stick' together. The felt is rolled until it shrinks and you end up with, well, not quite a work of art! But a piece of felt that with extra stitching and embellishment would make a book cover. During the day there was a lot of chatter but also times of quiet as people became absorbed in the creative process, our thoughts going who knows where?

Being creative enables us to express what is in our inner most thoughts. But I'm not creative I hear you protest. Well I believe we all have the capacity to be creative but that's for another occasion. Suffice it to say that it is an artists' creativity that helps us express feelings and emotions that we are not easily able to express ourselves. November is a month for remembering and the creative gifts of poets, musicians and artists of all genres help us in this process.

Early in the month there is an All Souls' service in which we remember loved ones before God. A service with readings, poems, music, which all help us to reflect on the sadness felt in losing someone close to us whether recently or in years past. This year the service is at 6pm on Sunday 4th November at Owmbly. During the service candles are lit in memory of those who have died and the names of loved ones are read out. You are very welcome to join us for this reflective service whether someone you know and love died recently or many years ago. If you would like the names of those who have died please let Sally Turnbull have them, in writing or by email, by Saturday 3rd November.

Remembrance Sunday on 11th November is this year a commemoration of the centenary of the cessation of hostilities of the Great War. Services and commemorations of all kinds will be held across the country as those who have given their life in war and conflict are remembered. Again, artists will be helping to express the emotions, the sadness, the despair, the futility of conflict but also hope for the future.

Danny Boyle has initiated Pages by the Sea where sand artists will be drawing portraits in the sand of a soldier from the war on beaches around the country, only to be washed away as the tide comes in. I wonder what feelings that will evoke in people? Poet Laureate, Carol Ann Duffy has been commissioned to write a poem for the occasion and there are the war poets and artists from conflicts past and present that help us reflect and remember.

The Owmbly Group will be holding some special services on Armistice Day and you are most welcome to join us, details of these are elsewhere in Signpost.

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP OF GRIMSBY

'...they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more; but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid...'

(Micah 4:3b,4a, NRSV)

These are words which speak of a future hope, a world at peace, a real peace, and not just the absence of conflict, a sense of wellbeing, of living in harmony with the world we've been given to share, of wanting the best for those we've been given to share that world with.

Words I was reminded of recently in conversation with a Russian Second Lieutenant on one of the ships at Immingham Docks, as he spoke in broken English of what he saw as the natural desire of all peoples to live like that - and his frustration at what he saw as the leaders of the nations, his own included, in failing to be able to achieve that.

And they are good words as we remember this month the ending of the Great War, the world's first example of what became known as 'total war'. 'It'll all be over by Christmas' the British Army were told - 1,568 days later, 888,246 British lives were lost. Nine to 15 million lives lost in total. Sixty-five million men from 30 countries involved. The 'war to end all wars' was what was hoped for then.

As Christians we know that ultimately the challenge of peace is not one of political solutions, important as they may be, but one of dealing with the human heart.

That is actually what the passage in Micah looks forward to. A time when all men and women look to the 'mountain of the Lord, the house of the God of Jacob' and have their hearts and minds transformed by him, which then brings in that universal peace, which we all long to live in.

That's the ultimate vision, the ultimate hope - but until then, being peacekeepers, peacemakers in the different places we find ourselves in is something each of us is called to do, and something our world still desperately needs.

We welcomed in 8 reception children to Discovery class, who after attending our Busy Bees pre school have settled in tremendously well. A big well done to them. I'm sure a lot of you know of her as the headteacher of Faldingworth School, we are very lucky to be able share her expertise and experience with Faldingworth school.
