FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Dear Friends,

As I sat down to prepare these words the BBC was reporting that 'The UN [had] declared its highest level of emergency in Iraq as a humanitarian crisis [followed] the rapid advance by Islamic State militants in the north'. According to Kurdish officials, 'the situation in Dohuk province, with 150,000 refugees, was now critical', while, and again according to the BBC, 'Heavy shelling [had] been heard in the rebel-held Ukranian city of Doetsk as a Russian convoy [approached] the Ukranian border' and 'Israel and Palestinians [had begun a] tense five-day Gaza truce'. It all makes for rather grim reading, doesn't it? One can only hope and pray that by the time you come to read these words that the pain and suffering caused by each of these respective situations has eased and that there is peace.

As you might expect, the word 'peace' appears many, many times in the Bible. According to my Analytical Concordance to the Holy Bible, a directory of words and phrases, we have references that are suggestive to us of 'rest, ease, security'; 'completeness'; 'unity, concord'; 'to be at, have, or live in peace'; 'holding one's peace'; and 'to make peace'. I wonder how you think and speak of peace? Where do you tend to seek out peace in your life? Are you - or have you been - a peacemaker? What makes for perfect peace? Is peace and fulfilment your goal?

I once attended a course on conflict resolution and the message that I took away from that valuable time was that if your goal in life is to always win and to come out on top, then remember that someone will have to lose. This message still comes to mind from time to time, as do the words of Jesus in the Gospel according to John: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid' (14:27). Jesus chooses his words with care; his message is clear for us: in him we may find the gift of peace, a peace that is distinct from our worldly assumptions about peace; an enduring peace.

I do hope that as we move into the month of September the world is beginning to become a more peaceful place. Prayer is needed and, if you have a moment and Internet access, why not visit the website for The Foundation for Relief and Reconciliation in the Middle East (frrme.org). Here you will be able to read regular updates from Canon Andrew White, the Vicar of St George's Church in Baghdad, Iraq, and also from Dr Sarah Ahmed. As you read you may well feel inspired by their courage and dedication in working to overcome brokenness and broker unity. You might also notice that the words of Dr Ahmed begin with 'Because, I Love Peace' and end with 'Peace and Love'.

Let us make it our prayer that peace for these people will come and that one day there will be peace in the world. With my prayers and best wishes,



Health Crossroads

A couple of friends of mine have just done an "Ironman" (which for the uninitiated is swimming for 2.4 miles, cycling for 112 miles and then running for 26.2 miles!) NORMANBY & OWMBY

Normanby & Owmby War Memorial

As some of you may recall, as it was quite a while ago, it was the intention to have the war memorial repaired in time for our annual service on November 11th, especially as this year is the **100th Anniversary of the start of WW1**.

In order to carry out these repairs we have had to jump through so many bureaucratic hoops due to the fact that it is in the old church yard but at long last we have been given permission.

The work that is required entails removing the memorial, breaking up the broken concrete base and replacing it. A stone mason has to repair damage to the memorial granite and re assemble it in position, also restoring and straightening up the stone curtilage to the foundation.

We do have funds from the sale of the 2 books that were written about the villagers of Normanby and Owmby who went to the two World Wars but sadly this is not enough to cover the cost of the work. Work that is needed to restore the memorial to its former glory and which will again serve as a lasting and fitting reminder to the debt we all owe these brave young men.

In order to raise the additional funds required, both Parish Councils are looking into any available grants but we feel that villagers may also want to contribute to the cost of the work, especially in this the Anniversary year of WW1, a war that changed the lives of so many forever.

To that end you will be receiving donation envelopes in the hope that you can see your way to contribute whatever money you can spare towards the repairs. NORMANBY-BY-SPITAL PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

At the meeting held on 16th July Cllrs A Carter and D Clinch were unable to attend and there were no members of the public present.

Private Lane has been resurfaced properly and it is hoped it will last a long time in good condition. Public footpath No 3 has only been cleared a certain length and the Clerk will ask for the rest of it cut back. It has been requested that the pavements on the bends of Main Street/Front Street and Main Street/Private Lane be resurfaced as they have become a danger to pedestrians. The possibility of a pavement from Manor Cliff to the telephone exchange is more than likely going to happen, though we are still arguing the point.

At long last, **the war memorial** will be repaired and a new base constructed, before November 11th. There were a lot of obstacles we had to get past, but have managed it. There is still a shortfall of money for these repairs, and, as you will have read on the previous page, we are asking for donations. For residents in Normanby, your envelopes will be collected personally by a Parish Councillor, to save you taking them to the Post Office.

The fees for burials in Owmby and Normanby Cemetery are being revised.

The notice in the Signpost and the notices on **the cemetery gates** seem to have stopped the gates being opened inwards - most of the time. Will those who open the big gates inwards please stop as, apart from damaging the post, it is most disrespectful. As is - those who walk their dogs through the cemetery, will you please, if your dog fouls, clear it up. This goes for any pavements or grass verges in the village. Please clear up the mess if your dog fouls.





WELTON HEALTH CENTRE NEWS

We have received several notifications from patients relating to 'phone calls from individuals purporting to have connections with the surgery and asking for answers to medically related queries. Please be reassured the doctors and staff will always introduce themselves and explain the reason we are calling and if you are in any doubt as to the authenticity of the caller, we would prefer that you decline to disclose information and call the surgery telephone number to confirm any details.

Reminder to patients to ensure that all polio diphtheria and tetanus vaccinations are up to date - even if only travelling to Europe - please ask at reception if not sure about your immunity.

We are keen to promote our smoking cessation services - please ask at reception if you wish to take advantage of this - appointments are available at various times including Monday evenings.

Flu vaccines are expected in the practice in the middle of September and appointments will be available as soon as they arrive. In addition we are holding a Saturday morning drop in session on Saturday 27th September 9.00am - 11.30am. If you are in the "at risk" group please come in as early as possible to maximise the benefit - if unsure, check with reception staff. If you normally have the vaccination please don't wait to be invited ! This year children aged 2 - 4 years old are included in the "at risk" group - the rationale being that younger children spread the infection quickly and by treating them this helps to prevent the spread. Children are given a nasal spray, not an injection.

If you have not yet signed up for online ordering of prescriptions, please do so as soon as possible. Those using the original system of ordering prescriptions via the website will not be able to use this after 30th September - the latest system gives each person a password and enables them to go directly to their own record and select the authorised repeats to order and the system is a lot safer and slicker to use. Forms to sign up for this are available on the Practice website or from reception or dispensary.

Last month 21.5 hrs of appointments were booked and not kept - 42 doctors and 58 nursing. Please let us know if you are not able to use your appointment so that others can do so.
